# Sustainable Water Project



#### PROPONENT

LOCKYER VALLEY REGIONAL COUNCIL

This project will provide water security to Lockyer Valley horticulturalists by supplementing existing ground water supplies with additional water that is both sustainable and reliable.

The proposal is a water pipeline distribution network to supply long term water security for agriculture. The project includes 297km of pipeline with connections to 251 properties and will deliver 1,923 new permanent jobs.

The project will source water from Wivenhoe Dam or potentially the Bundamba Treatment Plant and Western Corridor Recycled Water Scheme and connect to the three existing storages of Lake Clarendon, Atkinsons Dam and Lake Dyer.

Modelling confirms that with the recommissioning of the Western Corridor Water Recycling Scheme, taking water from Wivenhoe Dam for irrigation will not have an impact on South East Queensland's urban water supply.
